Historical Time Series - Banks in Switzerland

In its Historical Time Series collection, the Swiss National Bank (SNB) is issuing a new publication called *Banks in Switzerland*. For the publication, data on the Swiss banking industry have been processed statistically and a commentary has been provided. The SNB has been collecting these data since 1907, the year of its foundation. Then, as now, it needed them in order to fulfil its statutory mandate.

The tabular section of the publication focuses mainly on data from banks' balance sheets and profit and loss statements. In addition, it presents information on off-balance-sheet business, staff numbers and bank offices. Wherever possible, unbroken time series dating back to 1906 are published.

The commentary section outlines the main legal requirements affecting the SNB's banking statistics. It also contains information on the statistical surveys upon which the data are based, on specific definitions and on the bank categories.
